**Kirsten Weld** is Professor of History at Harvard University. She is the author of *Paper Cadavers: The Archives of Dictatorship in Guatemala* (Duke University Press, 2014), which won the 2015 WOLA-Duke Human Rights Book Award and the 2016 Best Book Award from the Latin American Studies Association's Recent History and Memory Section. *Paper Cadavers* analyzes how history is produced as social knowledge through an historical and ethnographic study of the archives generated by Guatemala's National Police. Dr. Weld is currently writing her second book, *Ruins and Glory: The Long Spanish Civil War in Latin America*, which examines the impact and legacy of the Spanish Civil War in the Americas.
